
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Donation Agreement

All consent forms must explicitly specify that the interviewee gives permission for the interview to be donated, and the level of access must be clearly discernable

Levels of Access

- Open Public Access 1: Dissemination and reproduction through any method and media.
 Web consent.
- Open Public Access 2: Interview and documentation available at COHDS and at some Montreal Life Stories partners, but no transmissions or reproductions. No web consent.
- Limited Access: Only researchers with a signed access agreement can see the interviews and they must be viewed at COHDS. Identity of the interviewee is concealed to everyone but the researcher. No web consent.
- Anonymous: The original interview has been destroyed and only the transcript remains with no indication of the identity of the interviewee. The transcript can be reproduced and transmitted in an online database or any other type of publication or public presentation. Web consent.

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
